## Speakers:

**Johanna Isosävi**, PhD (University of Helsinki) is a researcher and University Lecturer of French language and an active science communicator. She has examined politeness in authentic interactions between Finnish- and French-speaking interactants. She and her colleague **Camilla Lindholm**, a Professor in Nordic languages at Tampere University, have recently published a book *Väitöksen jälkeen* ("After PhD"). Camilla's main research interests are interaction in institutional settings and linguistically asymmetric interaction.

**Julia Korkman**, Julia Korkman, PhD, Åbo Akademi University, Adjunct professor, title of docent, Helsinki University, is specialized in investigative interviewing, investigating crimes against children and witness psychology more broadly. Her current research at Åbo Akademi focuses on investigative interviewing and legal decision making, and she is responsible for several large-scale training programmes for professionals. She is also the next president of the European Association for Psychology and Law.

**Christina Salmivalli** is a Professor of Psychology and the Deputy Head of the INVEST research flagship at the University of Turku. She is an expert on peer relations and school bullying. Christina and her research group have developed the evidence-based international intervention program KiVa-koulu.

## Panelists:

**Kimmo Feldt**, after receiving a PhD in psychology at the University of Helsinki, worked in the field of HR and people processes in expert, trainer, manager and director level positions. He has engaged in a wide variety of local and global talent management projects. His areas of expertise include individual assessment, managerial development and human risk analyses.

**Johanna Kaakinen** received a PhD from the University of Turku. After a postdoc year in the US in 2005, she worked at the University of Tampere and University of Turku. In 2017-2019 Johanna was a senior research fellow at the Turku Institute for Advanced Studies. Currently she is directing the FINSCI – a national consortium project that is funded by the Strategic Research Council (SRC). She is also the Vice Chair of the Dopsy Board.

**Paavo Leppänen**, Professor and Vice Dean of the Faculty of Education and Psychology at the University of Jyväskylä, conducts and directs research in the field of developmental cognitive neuroscience. He has extensive experience in brain and behavioural research. He has previously served as the Dopsy Board Chair and he has been an active member of the Dopsy network for many years.

**Matti Laine** is a Professor at the Department of Psychology and Logopedics at Åbo Akademi University. Matti has long term experience in the field of psychology and neurology. His current research is mainly related to working memory and executive function in health and in disease, as well as in cognitive training and its neurocognitive mechanisms.
